Applicant Grants Pack 2026

The SALHN Patient Care Grant Round is designed to enhance the hospital experience and wellbeing of patients, families, and carers across the Southern Adelaide Local Health Network (SALHN).

The round supports practical, patient-centred initiatives that enhance comfort, care quality, recovery outcomes, and equity, as well as prevention and early intervention initiatives that reduce future health burden.

This grant round focuses philanthropic funding where it can add value beyond core services, enabling ideas shaped by lived experience and frontline insight to be tested, delivered, and shared.

Funding will prioritise initiatives that:

- Align with SALHN's Strategic Plan
- Align with Flinders Foundation's Theory of Change
- Demonstrate measurable improvements in patient-centred care, equity, and wellbeing
- Can be delivered within 12 months

The process emphasises equity, transparency, and patient-centred innovation, reflecting the shared commitment of SALHN and Flinders Foundation to delivering exceptional care, without exceptions.

Funding Available

- \$50,000 annually for SALHN-based projects (GST exclusive)
- Additional \$50,000 in 2026 for Patient Care Grants benefiting patients affected by Cancer, funded by proceeds from The Ribbon Ball
- Up to \$10,000 per project
- Funding is GST exclusive.

Program Purpose

To accelerate access to initiatives that enhance the patient and family experience, support recovery, and address disparities in healthcare access.

Outcomes We Seek

Successful projects will contribute to one or more of the following outcomes:

- Enhanced patient comfort, satisfaction, and care experience
- Faster recovery and improved clinical outcomes
- Reduced barriers to timely and equitable care
- Greater wellbeing for patients and families during hospital stays

Eligibility

Eligible Applicants

Applications are open to:

- SALHN services and departments, including hospital and community settings
- VollieCare
- University staff in joint roles, when applying under their SALHN responsibilities
- Flinders Centre for Innovation in Cancer clinical roles (aligned to Cancer Patient Care Round)
- All applications must be endorsed by the relevant Clinical Director or Co-Director.

What Can Be Funded

Eligible requests include initiatives such as:

- Patient wellbeing and comfort initiatives (e.g. waiting area improvements, therapeutic equipment, creative therapy programs, volunteer-led initiatives)
- Initiatives that enhance hospital environments, recovery experiences, and family support
- Practical projects that demonstrate clear patient, family, or carer benefit and can be delivered within 12 months
- Projects that demonstrate a clear alignment to the SALHN Strategic Plan and Flinders Foundation Theory of Change
- Fulfil all other application requirements as per the Expression of Interest

What Cannot Be Funded

Funding will not support:

- Retrospective purchases or completed projects
- Everyday consumables, ongoing operational costs, or staff salaries
- Like-for-like replacements with no net improvement in care
- Major building works or non-integrated IT infrastructure
- Standalone software not intrinsic to the project
- Professional development or training activities
- Core SA Health responsibilities

Fill out the online Expression of Interest form and attach endorsement and all required supporting information on the Flinders Foundation website.

Step 3: Submit your application

You'll be:

- Assigned a Relationship Manager from Flinders Foundation.

- Acknowledging support from Flinders Foundation and SALHN in communications.

10. If You're Unsuccessful

You'll receive:

- A notification with consolidated feedback.
- You may receive an invitation to be listed in the Flinders Foundation "unmet needs listing" for future funding sourced on your behalf.
- Support to resubmit or revise your project for future grant rounds.


